

INSIDER TIP In memoriam

Micha Ullman's memorial to the Burning of the Books on Bebelplatz under the Nazi dictatorship draws our gaze downwards. Below the sheet of glass empty bookcases can be seen that symbolise the 20,000 books burned here on 10 May 1933 → p. 31

INSIDER TIP The village within the city

Surrounded by apartment blocks in Neukölln, the historical village of *Rixdorf* looks from another era with its church, blacksmith and barns → p. 59

INSIDER TIP Telling history

Former inmates guide visitors through the *prison* run by the former East German State Security (Stasi) and tell their personal stories of solitary confinement and psychological terror → p. 59

INSIDER TIP Stalinist glory

The 9Om-wide *Karl-Marx-Allee* in Friedrichshain with its monumental, Moscow-style housing blocks is impressive (photo above) → p. 37

INSIDER TIP Paddling in the Spree

In the Freischwimmer restaurant and water lounge (photo right) you can either enjoy the romantic location on the river bank or you can rent a canoe or kayak and explore the Spree. Life jackets available for children → p. 69

INSIDER TIP Hip design

The shop Aus Berlin presents moreor-less useful — and many weird things created by around 270 Berlin designers. If you are after pills to cure lovesickness, bookends in the shape of pieces of the Berlin Wall or a Television Tower Iollipop, this is the place for you → p. 80

INSIDER III A good night story

The breakfast room doubles up as a library. Readings with famous or still-unknown authors are held regularly in the lounge of the *Literaturhotel* in the suburb of Friedenau. Some literature Nobel Prize winners live(d) just round the corner → p. 102

INSIDER IIP A drink with a view

You can enjoy the magnificent view from the roof of the *Park Inn Hotel* (40th floor) opposite the Television Tower — and sip a cocktail at the same time. There are even deck-chairs waiting for you → p. 102

INSIDER TIP Nostalgia for nerds

Excellent interactive exhibition in the Computerspielemuseum (computer games museum) featuring lots of games you might remember from your childhood \Rightarrow p. 30

Try the finest Turkish sweets from one of Turkey's best confectioners right in the city centre at the *Confiserie Orientale* > p. 78

Overnight in a caravan at the *Hüttenpalast* located on a factory floor in Neukölln – a unique and extremely comfortable experience! \rightarrow p. 104

INSIDER TIP The BVG's convertible trains

Public transport with a difference: travel the underground in carriages with the roof down – an experience not to be missed! → p. 122

Discover new places and save money

Lunchtime concerts

From September to June, you will be able to enjoy a free lunchtime concert every Tuesday in the *Philharmonie*. The performing ensembles are first-rate and include the Berlin Philharmonic and scholarship holders from the orchestra's academy \rightarrow p. 95

Wall art

The Eastside Gallery (photo), the longest open-air gallery in the world, is located to the south of the Ostbahnhof railway station. Take a look at what artists have left for future generations on a 1,316 m (4,317 ft) long piece of the former Berlin Wall → p. 48

New Berliner bike tours

Hop on the saddle and away you go. The Allgemeine Deutsche Fahrrad Club (ADFC) offers *free city tours* on bike. Bikes can be hired first at a low cost for example from *Next-Bike (www.nextbike.de)* → p. 129

Rock for free

Free admission on Thursdays from 7pm at the Sageclub in the Heinrich-Heinrich-Straße underground station! Dance the night away or just enjoy being a part of the scene $\rightarrow p$, 90

Déjeuner sur l'herbe

In summer, the Berliners pack their picnic baskets and make a pilgrimage to the *English Garden* in Tiergarten to relax and listen to free concerts of jazz and Klezmer music. Join in the fun! → p. 41

Life on the border

Get a vivid impression of life behind the wall at the Gedenkstätte Berliner Mauer (Berlin Wall Memorial) at the Nordbahnhof station: with mine patrols (without any mines though), eyewitness accounts, observation tower, documentary films etc. — and what's best: admission to everything is free

Unique experiences

Quadriga with twelve legs

The Brandenburger Tor is an absolute must. Not only the street artists let their hair down here, there are also many hobby photographers. Who can take the most beautiful picture of this city landmark? → p. 41

"TV asparagus"

This is the name the people of Berlin have affectionately given the *Fernsehturm* on Alexanderplatz. You will really miss out on something if you don't visit the viewing platform 203 m (666 ft) above street level—it's the best view in Berlin → p. 34

Wall taxi

A taxi will take you to all remnants of the Berlin Wall in the city. The driver will point out the most important places and garnish his stories with his personal experiences in the former divided city \rightarrow p. 130

Curry 36

Cheap but tasty – that's all a Berlin currywurst needs to be, with some chips or a bread roll to go along with it. The Berliners queue up at *Curry 36* in Kreuzberg for a grilled sausage with curry powder $\rightarrow p$. 74

Sophisticated shopping

Time and time again, the Ku'damm has been pronounced dead, but the many customers in the fashionable boutiques on the elegant boulevard cannot all be wrong. This is where Berlin is at its most glamorous in a setting of magnificent old buildings: typical of Berlin – but sometimes beautiful can be expensive $\rightarrow p$. 54

Don't forget your swimsuit...

You will feel like you are at the seaside: deck chairs and sand as far as the eye can see. The wide expanse of water at *Wannsee* is an inviting place to sunbathe or swim, and a snack bar is never far away (photo) \rightarrow p. 24

Jazz in a beer garden

Real Kreuzbergers don't give a hoot about the yuppies in Mitte or Friedrichshain when they sit back with a pint in their hands in one of the beer gardens—listening to live jazz in *Yorckschlösschen*, for example $\rightarrow p.94$

COSTS: approx. 50 euros for a day ticket on the public transport network, Segway hire and snacks















IMPORTANT TIPS: Buy a one-day BVG ticket (6.90 euros) to travel for free on all buses, underground and district line trains. Reserve a table in the Dachgartenrestaurant Käfer in advance.

From here, you will have a magnificent view over the inner city and can also follow the walkway up into the dome of the building. Hire
