INSIDER TIP Unlimited fun

Decke Trumm (kettle drums) and Quetschebüggel (accordions): the square An der Eiche is the best place to celebrate Weiberfastnacht or Fat Thursday → p. 47

INSIDER TIP Authentic Kölsch

Once the meeting place for First World War veterans, the *Früh em Veedel* beer garden and pub is still known as the "church of the invalids" in the colloquial language. Here they speak and drink *Kölsch* → p. 56

INSIDER TIP Classics from the kitchen

If you are a fan of hearty food and a cosy historic flair, the *Haxenhaus* with its wood panelling and timbered ceilings is just the right thing $\rightarrow p.56$

INSIDER TIP Photo art

Find classics of American photographic art in the Südstadt at the Galerie Thomas Zander → p. 64

INSIDER TIP Beautiful graves

For more than two hundred years Cologne's prominent citizens have been buried in the *Melaten Cemetery* − politicians, artists, scientists, entrepreneurs and union leaders. Many of its 19th century tombs and grave stones are under heritage protection → p. 51

Weidengasse Weidengasse

Junk shops selling original puppet figures from the Hänneschen Theater, Bosnian wedding dresses, Turkish butchers, travel agencies and mobile shops lend *Weidengasse* a multicultural flair. Special tip: there are more Madonna sculptures on the facades here than on any other street in Cologne → p. 47

the Rheinauhafen

Their fantastic panoramic views make the three Kranhäuser (or crane houses) Cologne's most expensive addresses. The former harbour mile entices with museums, galleries, beer gardens, concerts ... (photo left) \rightarrow p. 48

Fine classical music at lunchtime

The half-hour *PhilharmonieLunch* performances of classical music take place at lunchtime. The Gürzenich Orchester and the WDR-Sinfonieorchester rehearse on alternate Thursdays → p. 74

The greenhouses with tropical plants and succulents in the Botanischer Garten (Botanical Gardens) are open 365 days of the year. Depending on the season, special exhibitions are held with flowering dahlias, camellias or orchids (photo) \rightarrow p. 51

When stones tell the earth's history

A total of 50,000 fossils and minerals and a thrilling trip through time from the Big Bang to the present: the Geo-Museum at the University of Cologne $\rightarrow p.51$

Unforgettable sounds in the cathedral

Summer parties

Unique experiences

Underground time machine

Go underground in Cologne and take a journey into the city's past in the Rathaus (town hall) quarter. follow the trail of its Roman and medieval citizens. The excavations are set to be incorporated into an Archeological zone $\rightarrow p$, 28

A funny bird

Order ne Halve Hahn (half a chicken) in a Brauhaus but don't be surprised when you are served a rye roll and cheese. This authentic dish with the confusing name is served at the Früh am Dom and other places \rightarrow p. 56

Puppet plays

Even if you don't understand a word: the Puppenspiele der Stadt Köln – the official name of the Hänneschen Theatre – presents satirical plays in Kölsch, the local dialect (photo) \rightarrow p. 77

Three days of fun

"Three days of fun, no regrets, that is carnival" is the local saying about the Straßenkarneval – a street carnival and masquerade festival that sees virtually all citizens of Cologne in fancy dress $\rightarrow p$. 100

Meet the waiters

The Köbes are an institution in Rhine gastronomy and belong to the folklore of Cologne's brewery pubs. To see just how witty and gruff (and rude!) they can be visit the Brauhaus Päffaen → p. 56

Speaking and drinking Kölsch

Kölsch is the only language that one can drink. This hoppy, light beer is great for a guick drink and is served in small 0.2 L (7 fl oz.) glasses. See how fluent you can be at the Schreckenskammer with its own Kölsch \rightarrow p. 57

Have a laugh in the Volkstheater

The burlesque farces presented at the Volkstheater Millowitsch have kept the locals entertained for over 160 years and are as popular as ever $\rightarrow p.77$
