INSIDER TIP Just dive in


The Liámis Dive Centre offers try dive courses in safe coves as well as adventurous trips to wrecks and into sea caves \rightarrow p. 94

Music of the spheres beneath the theatre

Not only is a visit to the Roman theatre in Kos Town free – at the catacombs, spherical background music accompanies you through the history of the Roman building (photo) \Rightarrow p. 40

An ancient bargain

Normally, you have to pay admission to tour the *Archaeological Museum* in Kos Town and the *Asklípion*, the most significant archaeological site on the island. But, on certain days in the off-season, you can visit both places for free \rightarrow p. 48

Art at a hotel

Even if you're not staying at the *Neptune Resort*, you can still admire the works of Peter R. Müller for free. On the premises of one of the island's best hotels, the Bavarian artist has recreated deities and heroic figures from Greek mythology as sculptures → p. 59

A view fit for a king

The only other way to get a panoramic view like that from atop the walls of the *Antimáchia Castle* is to climb aboard an aeroplane. Not only is this fantastic view free, but you can also experience the imposing fortress with its wilderness full of lizards inside at no cost \Rightarrow p. 53

A monastery picnic

At a restaurant, the prices would most likely reflect an amazing view like the one you can enjoy from the terrace of the abandoned monastery Ágios Ioánnis Pródromos.

Spa with a difference

At *Embrós Thérme* thermal water, heated to a temperature of 45 °C/112 °F, flows into the sea. In an improvised pool between the rocks you will find mostly Greeks taking a free thermal bath → p. 51

Truly public

Have you ever been present at a court session? At the *kafenion next to the court building* in Kos Town, you can follow court proceedings through the open doors with a cup of mocha in your hand → p. 43

Ottoman cuisine

The tavernas on the *village square in Platáni* nearly all bear Turkish names – because Kos is the only Greek island apart from Rhodes where Muslims originally from Turkey still have their home. A good opportunity for a culinary treat: the spicy secrets of Asia Minor are an experience for the palate \rightarrow p. 44

Cows on the beach

On Kos, cows are nearly as omnipresent as in India. You find them in the countryside, on the beach or in the odd quiet alleyway. This is the only place in Hellas you will see this – and between Tigáki and Mastichári is Cow Central → p. 65

Making new friends

The old farmers living right next to the ancient *tomb of Harmylos* in Pýli are often to be found sitting outside the small church waiting to chat to visitors and treat them with water or fruit – hospitality Koanstyle \rightarrow p. 62

Old times

If you want to see how older Koans lived when they were children, visit the *Traditional House* in Antimáchia, erected and furnished following historic models: cosy it might have been, though not very comfortable for sure. The attraction also shows how tourism has changed the island (photo) \rightarrow p. 52

Celebrate together

The small Koan churches located outside the villages usually have an area reserved for festivities with long tables and benches. If you're lucky, you can watch more than 1,000 locals eat, drink and party together after the service on the church feast day on the square at the church Panagía Stylóti near Kéfalos \rightarrow p. 78

WHAT TO PACK: swim gear, maybe a torch

Kos is small enough that you can get to know the entire island with a hired car in a single day. You will discover archaeological treasures nestled within the beautiful natural countryside and stroll through small villages in the island's interior. You can also learn about life on the island in earlier times, shop for arts and crafts and take a dip in the sea at one of the prettiest beaches on the island. A night-time swim in warm thermal water is a special treat at the end of the day.

Every corner of the earth has its own special charm. If you want to explore all the many different facets of this region, head off the beaten track or get tips for the best stops, breathtaking views, hand-picked restaurants or the best local activities, then these customised discovery tours are just the right thing. Choose the best route for the day and follow in the footsteps of the MARCO POLO authors - well-prepared to navigate your way to all the many highlights that await you along the tour.

08:00am Start early in the morning from 1 Kos Town \rightarrow p. 32 and drive to the 2 Asklípion \rightarrow p. 48. In the balmy early morning air around 8:30am, the view of the coast of Asia Minor across the water is still clear. Enjoy your first cappuccino or espresso on the village square in (3) Platáni → p. 40, before you head off on the main island road to \bigcirc Antimáchia \rightarrow p. 52, the village at the heart of the island. At the Traditional House in the village centre, you can travel back in time and explore the island's history.
