### Panoramic views

The ¼ mi-long *Monteliusvägen* footpath extends along the rocky fringe of Södermalm and offers a fantastic panorama. In contrast to other viewpoints, the cityscape laid out before you, with Lake Mälar, Stadshuset and Riddarholmen, comes without a price-tag  $\rightarrow$  p. 28

### Cool curves

*Ice-skating* fans have a heyday during Stockholm's winter. You can skate on the artificial ice rinks in Vasaparken and at the Östermalm sporting complex every day, free of charge → p. 51

### Singing bench

Monica Zetterlund become famous in the 1960s with her homage to Stockholm 'Sakta vi går genom stan'. After her death in 2005 in a fire, a park in Vasastan was named after her. Entrance is free and you can listen to Zetterlund's voice, sitting on a *teak bench*: as soon as you sit down the music starts → p. 36

### A forest of newspapers

Stockholm's City Library, the *Stadsbiblioteket*, has more than 100 newspapers, including 30 international ones, on its shelves. Here, visitors can catch up on what's happening in the world in a tranquil environment free of charge  $\rightarrow p$ . 36

### Young virtuosos

Students have been trained as musicians, composers, conductors and teachers at the *Royal Music University* since 1771.

### The Royals and the people

If you want to get a glimpse of the royal family you only have to take up position on one of the streets in Stockholm on 6 June on *Nationaldagen*, the Swedish national holiday. That is the day when member of the royal family travel through the town to Skansen to celebrate with their subjects  $\Rightarrow$  p. 110

### Noble (or Nobel) location

You can spot Stockholm's *town hall* and its tower with three golden crowns from far away: the *Stadshuset* is the symbol of the Swedish capital city. This is where weddings take place, the city is administered and celebrations are held. One of them, on 10 December, is the gala dinner given in honour of the Nobel Prize winners. → p. 55

### Healthy living in the big city

Take a leaf out of their book: the Stockholmers are quite health-conscious; they eat healthily (mostly) and get plenty of exercise – preferably outdoors. And they like to buy organic. Produce grown organically, and locally where possible, is booming. You can get your hands on some at *Saltå Kvarn*, for example, on Södermalm → p. 72

IMPORTANT TIPS: Outside the high season (May-Sept) the S7 tram takes you to the Abba Museum, instead of the heritage tram no. 7N. Then, instead of the ferry, bus or tram take you to Slussen (www.sl.se).

As an alternative to the Fjäderholmen dinner, head for trendy Ekstedt  $\rightarrow$  p. 62 on Östermalmstorg for your evening meal, then on to **(E)** Sturecompagniet (Thu—Sat only 10pm—3am!).
