### INSIDER III Cypriot bohemia

From the outside, the Art Café 1900 in Lárnaka seems nothing special, but don't be put off: inside, it has become the meeting point for the regional and international art scene – thanks to its excellent food and good wines as well as classic cocktails from the bar  $\rightarrow$  **p. 39** 

### INSIDER TIP Thank God for Britannia

Lying as they do within the sovereign territory of the British military base, the *beaches of Avdímou* are not very well known. Which means, so far, they've not been spoilt by hotels and urban sprawl  $\rightarrow$  **p. 48** 

### ISIDER TIP Bookshop restaurant

You will find something to feed your body and soul at *Rüstems Bookshop* in northern Nicosia. On the upper floor of this traditional book shop, tables have been set up between the shelves where the chef dishes up home-style Cypriot dishes. You are more than welcome to read while you eat!  $\rightarrow$  p. 59

### INSIDER TIP Market at the minaret

Plan your trip to Nicosia for a Wednesday or a Saturday, when you can take in the *farmers' market* on the medieval Constanza bastion on the city wall (photo above)  $\rightarrow$  p. 60

### INSIDER TIP The best mesé

In the *Laterna* taverna in Páfos, your host is an ecological winegrower and a passionate chef too. The wines come from small winemakers of the region  $\rightarrow$  p. 68

#### INSIDER TIP Living with artists

In the hotel *Kinirás* in the Old Town of Páfos, paintings and frescoes by hosts and guests adorn the walls of the rooms and the secluded courtyard  $\rightarrow$  **p.** 70

### NSIDER TIP Aphrodite up close

The temple of Aphrodite in Páfos was a place of pilgrimage in ancient times. The goddess was worshiped in the form of a stone fertility symbol. The *Idol* is on display in Koúklia  $\rightarrow$  p.73

### INSIDER TIP A village with history

Modern art dominates life in what is today *Lémba*. The village's 4,500 year-old predecessor, right next door and hardly visited, has been reconstructed  $\rightarrow$  **p. 74** 

#### INSIDER TIP Top table

In Pródromos, the highest village in Cyprus, enjoy a delicious Cypriot lunchtime buffet at the *Byzántio* taverna, featuring a large selection of vegetables, meat, salads and local fruit and veg  $\rightarrow$  p. 84

### INSIDER TIP Dune beaches

At the small *Balci Plaza* hotel you are a stone's throw from the empty dune beaches of the Karpaz peninsula, and have a lot of space to yourself (photo below)  $\rightarrow$  p. 93

### INSIDER TIP White pearl

Only at the White Pearl hotel do you get to enjoy the panoramic view of Kerýneia's port from your own balcony and live right on the harbour promenade  $\rightarrow p.95$ 

### INSIDER TIP Alone by the sea

Tourism has yet to reach the western coast of northern Cyprus. The beaches of Akdeniz attract sea turtles and the odd swimmer or two. At the moment, only one restaurant caters to beach guests  $\rightarrow$  p. 95

### INSIDER TIP Seafood

Enjoy fish *mesé* at a good price with a view of the sea at the family-run restaurant *Arapis* near the beach of Coral Bay and yet still off the beaten tourist track  $\rightarrow$  **p. 72** 

### INSIDER TIP Babbling brook

There are many hiking trails on Cyprus, but only the *Caledonia Trail* at Tróodos keeps crossing a stream, eventually leading to a waterfall  $\rightarrow$  p. 117

### INSIDER TIP Classical music in the monastery

For a whole month, famous virtuosi play classical music in Bellapaís Monastery between Gothic tracery and lancet windows  $\rightarrow$  p. 118

Discover new places and save money

### **Concerts for free**

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On nearly every Sunday in the year, Páfos, Limassol and Lárnaka host free concerts, sometimes folk or rock, sometimes jazz or classical. All events are organised by the relevant municipal authorities  $\rightarrow$  p. 118

### Where wishes (might) become reality

Gain deep insights into Greek Cypriots' popular piety between the golden shimmering mosaics and expressive wall paintings of *Kýkko Monastery* and take up the invitation to look after your future at a wish tree. All this is still for free (photo)  $\rightarrow$  p. 80

### Village life in the past

At *Melandra House*, a small private museum in northern Cyprus, you can delve into an otherwise long-forgotten world. Learn what daily life was like in the villages on the island in the 1950s  $\rightarrow$  p. 89

### Freebie beach

Many of the better beaches around Kyréneia/Girne in northern Cyprus charge a fee. For some free sun worship and a swim choose the pretty sandy beaches of Famagusta at Hotel Palm Beach and in front of the excavations of Sálamis  $\rightarrow$  p. 90

### Make art not accounts

A bank building where the talk is not about accounts for once is the museum of the *Bank of Cyprus Cultural Foundation* in Nicosia's Old Town. Stroll through 8,000 years of Cypriot art history without having to pay a penny for the privilege  $\rightarrow$  p. 54

#### 🛑 Rose picking

Get up early for a free holiday experience like no other at the *rose house* in May and early June. Pick you rown fresh rose petals to make rosewater!  $\rightarrow$  **p. 78** 

### Capital Cypriot meal

In the taverna *Matthéos* in Nicosia's Old Town you can eat like the locals. Simple dishes like stew and sweet potato with pork are always accompanied by a platter of crudités and olives  $\rightarrow$  p. 59

### • Folk dancing on the village square

If you want to experience Cypriot folk dancing on a village square, head for the platía in Pissoúri to watch the authentic *folkloric* demonstration held once a week (photo)  $\rightarrow$  p. 51

### Cohabiting in no-man's land

One of the very few villages on Cyprus where Greek and Turkish Cypriots still live together is *Pýla* near Lárnaka. On the village square you have the choice between Greek-Cypriot and Turkish beer and can meet UN soldiers: Pýla, you see, is in no-man's-land between Northern and Southern Cyprus  $\rightarrow$  p. 43
