At the base of Mount Sinai is the *Mount Sinai Eco-lodge*, a lodge run by Bedouins as a retreat. It is off the grid and ideal for some reflection and peace and quiet. A monastery within walking distance makes fantastic homemade food which visitors eat in absolute silence  $\Rightarrow p.56$ 

### Dive all day and party all night

El Fanar Beach in Sharm El-Sheikh is a diver's paradise by day that turns into a party zone in the evening. The perfect combination for young adventure travellers and for those who are young at heart. Highly rated overall: be it the coral reefs in the day or the boisterous party nights → p. 45

# THE PERFECT ROUTE

Experience the diversity of the Red Sea all the way from Taba via Luxor to Soma Bay with small detours off the beaten track

### **CASTLES, PORTS, A FJORD AND A HIPPIE TOWN**

The picturesque harbour town of ① Taba → p. 48 right in the north on the Gulf of Aqaba is the ideal departure point for a boat trip to the Pharaoh's Island, where you can view a derelict Crusader fortress. Only a short distance south is ② Castle Zaman → p. 40, a designer hotel and the perfect place to lounge by the pool with a drink in hand while soaking up the medieval atmosphere. 15 km/9mi south of Highway 35, that hugs the coastline, you'll reach the ③ Marsa Murakh → p. 49 nature reserve. There you will find the inviting crystal clear waters and unspoilt coral reefs of the ④ The Fjord → p. 49 – ideal for snorkelling and diving. Then continue on via Ras Shaitan (Devil's Head) where you'll find ⑤ Castle Beach Camp → p. 40 with its secluded sandy beach before you head to ⑥ Nuweiba → p. 38, a Goa-style hippie town.

THE DESERT, THE BEDOUIN
AND BIBLICAL SITES
Highway 37 now branches off into the

interior. When you reach the **?** Coloured Canyons → p. 41 (photo above) leave your car and explore the fascinating valley on foot. Then head along main road number 36 to the biblical **3** 'Ain Khudra Oasis → p. 40, where you can set out with the Bedouin by camel along the pilgrim paths of antiquity to **3** White Canyon → p. 40, a true marvel of nature. The route continues on number 36 right through the middle of the Sinai Desert leading to Nabi Sahlih and from there to the St Catherine Nature Protectorate. Must-see attractions here include

St Catherine's Monastery → p. 52 and 11 Gebel

Musa  $\rightarrow$  p. 57 (Mount Sinai), the biblical site of the

Ten Commandments and the burning bush.

BY THE SEASIDE

On the coast is **12** *Ras Abu Ghalum*  $\rightarrow$  p. 38, one of Egypt's most biodiverse national parks. In atmospheric **13** *Dahab*  $\rightarrow$  p. 34 you can take a stroll along the seaside promenade, go windsurfing or enjoy culinary delights in *Friend's Restaurant*. After a short stop at **14** *Naba National Park*  $\rightarrow$  p. 47

to admire the world's northernmost mangrove forest, it is back via Highway 35 to the chic seaside resort of **5** *Sharm El-Sheikh*  $\rightarrow$  p. 42 (photo below). This is where the Egyptian upper class like to spend their holidays, surrounded by beautiful beaches.

### **ANCIENT CIVILISATION**

Now you will continue your journey by air. Scheduled flights take an hour to be air. Scheduled flights take an hour to be always p. 94 where you can take in the impressive temple complexes of Luxor and Karnak, as well as the modern Luxor Museum. Then the route goes via a Nile ferry crossing to west Thebes p. 94 and into the realm of the dead, the Valley of Kings has Tutankhamun's tomb while the Valley of Queens has the tomb that Ramses II built for one of his principle wives, Nefertari. Other highlights include the Colossi of Memnon and Pharaoh Hatschepsut's breathtaking temple, Deir al-Bahri.

### **SHEER RELAXATION**

The route now continues back along main road 29 to the Red Sea and the

idyllic harbour village of (1) El Quseir  $\rightarrow$  p. 89, which – in contrast to other seaside resorts – has a centuries old history as a trading town. From here you can go on ex-

cellent dive safaris to the pristine coral reefs around the Brother Islands > p.99. Then you continue along the scenic coastal Highway 24 as it meanders to Soma Bay > p.84 where you can pamper yourself with the treatments offered at Les Thermes Marines des Cascades or, if you are more energetic, you can try your hand at a round of golf at the nearby award-winning golf course.
